Checklist PUPPY (8-16 weeks)

Follow this checklist to create positive experiences with the world around your puppies - use high value treats if they will take them.

Puppies are naturally curious, so we want them to explore everything around them in a positive and healthy way from a young age. The more experiences they encounter, the more they learn not to fear or be threatened by different environments, sounds, sights and smells.

If your puppy is unsure of a new experience:

- ✓ Stay calm, do not fuss over them or baby them
- Slightly increase the distance away, and gradually get closer
- ✓ Praise your puppy as they remain calm
- Make it positive and exciting
- Direct attention, praise and reward to desensitise
